Steiner Chilbi

This year marks the 90th Anniversary of the Steiner Chilbi, which takes place every year on the first weekend in October. Steiner Chilbi is a song composed by Jost Ribary senior in the style of Swiss Ländler music. The melody was premiered at a Chilbi in Steinen, SZ in the Swiss Canton of Schwyz. The Steiner-Chilbi has now become one of the most famous melodies in the Swiss music scene. The Steiner Chilbi is almost always performed in the central Swiss concert style with soprano saxophone, accordion, piano and double bass.

In the show "The Greatest Swiss Hits" on Swiss television, Steiner Chilbi was voted the fifth most popular title in the Homeland category in 2007. The song was also nominated again in 2008. Modern artists like DJ COOLMAX have also taken up this old melody and produced it again.



The Steiner Chilbi composer, Jost Ribary, born in Oberägeri in 1910, wrote over 800 "Tänzli". His musical companion since 1957 was accordionist René Wicky, this year's winner of the highest award in Swiss folk music, the Golden Treble Clef. René Wicky is probably one of the most important Ländler accordionists and composers in the Swiss folk music scene who has written over 1000 "Tänzlis" himself. From the age of fourteen, Jost Ribary worked as a factory worker in the Neuägeri spinning mill, then as a construction worker, assistant postman and farmer. In 1933, the year of the premiere of "Steiner Chilbi," which he had composed, he became an accordion tuner in Bachenbülach. However, his "home" became the restaurant "Konkordia" in Zurich's Niederdorf - he performed here every weekend. In the 1950s he also integrated his son Jost Ribary Junior into his Ländler band.



Ski museum to open in Canton Jura

Switzerland's first ski museum will welcome its first visitors to Le Boéchet in Canton Jura. The exhibition, housed in the former station restaurant of this village in the Franches-Montagnes region, is devoted to the history of downhill and cross-country skiing.

The new museum showcases the collection acquired over the years by Laurent Donzé. "It all started with a pair of skis in a barn," the cross-country skiing enthusiast told Keystone-SDA on Tuesday at the presentation of his museum. Over the years, he has amassed thousands of pairs of skis, poles, as well as boots, helmets, race numbers and bindings. The museum looks at the evolution of equipment over the years and hopes to attract experts and non-skiers alike. It invites them to delve into the history of the sport from its humble beginnings to the present day.

Zurich Researchers Design Octopus-Inspired Patch to Deliver Drugs:



Inspired by the suction cups on octopus tentacles, Zurich researchers have developed a patch for delivering medicines. The patch is stuck to the inside of the cheek and enables the delivery of medicines that would otherwise require a syringe.

To test their patch, the researchers loaded it with desmopressin, an approved diabetes drug for dogs, and stuck it on the oral mucosa, the lining or "skin" inside of the mouth, including cheeks and lips, of dogs. The patch stayed in the animals' mouths for three hours without falling off or causing irritation, the study showed.

The effect of the drug was comparable to the effect when given in tablet form. The researchers then had 40 volunteers stick the patch to the inside of their cheeks for half an hour without medication while they talked, walked and rinsed their mouths. Most of the patches stuck. In addition, the subjects reported that they would prefer the patch over injections for daily, weekly or monthly treatment.

According to the study, the patch could be suitable for insulin. Until now, diabetics have had to inject themselves with insulin several times a day. Other peptides and proteins can also only be administered by injection. Previous attempts to administer them via nasal sprays or microneedles showed only limited effectiveness, according to the study.
